DRESS CODE.

Directors, staff on duty and the Club's Professional are the only ones who will govern the interpretation of the dress code, including smart casual and religious headwear, and you are asked to please respect their decision if approached. "Smart casual" permits the wearing of smart, unripped jeans and training shoes. 'Religious headwear' permits coverings worn on the head that hold spiritual, cultural, or symbolic significance within a particular faith tradition.

Members are reminded that it is their responsibility to ensure that their guests are fully aware of the rules and that they are followed throughout their visit to the Club.

On the Course.

- **Shirts:** Recognised Golf shirts, with collar or mock-collar, to be worn and tucked into trousers/shorts **at all times** whilst on the Course. Ladies shirts may be worn as designed.
- **Trousers:** Must be tailored or plus2's or4's. No denim, drawstring waistband or external "cargo type" pockets and should not be tucked into socks.
- **Shorts:** Men's shorts to be tailored with no denim, drawstring waist or "cargo type with external pockets.
 - It is preferred that short socks should be predominately white. Long socks can be of any colour.
 - Ladies shorts/Capri trousers to be tailored and worn with ankle socks.
- **Hoodies:** Recognised golfing apparel hooded jumpers are allowed on the Course and clubhouse. They are not to display large logos/numbers.
- **Headgear:** To be worn correctly, i.e. with peak facing forward.
- **Shoes:** Recognised Golf shoes, made and designed for the purpose are to be worn on the course.

All of the above applies when using the Course, practise and putting areas.

Clubhouse, lounge dining room and terrace.

- Smart casual attire can be worn at all times including shorts.
- All headgear to be removed, including hoods, whilst inside the Clubhouse (exceptions will be made for 'religious headwear' or headwear for medical purposes). 'Religious headwear' permits coverings worn on the head that hold spiritual, cultural, or symbolic significance within a particular faith tradition.
- Shirts can be untucked from trousers/shorts.
- Golf clothing can be worn but must not be wet/muddy. No waterproof suits to be worn in lounge/dining room.
- Golf shoes: Soft spiked golf shoes can be worn in lounge providing that they are clean, dry and free from grass cuttings etc, if that is not possible then you must change your shoes. Metal spikes are not permitted in lounge. **NO** golf shoes are permitted in dining room. Stockinged feet are not permitted.
- Open toed footwear e.g sandals, sliders etc must be worn with socks, ladies may wear open toed footwear without.
- Enclosed footwear may be worn without socks.
- If members arrive for their round in work gear they are asked to enter via the rear staircase.
