TERMS & CONDITIONS FOR VISITING SOCIETIES

GENERAL

- 1. Club society days are all day on Tuesdays and Thursdays, and Friday mornings from 9.30am to 10.30am.
- 2. Society bookings are considered provisional until receipt of a <u>non-refundable</u> deposit of £100.00. Provisional dates will be released after 21 days should a deposit not be received.
- 3. The Club reserves the right to refuse bookings from any society, and shall not be bound to give any reason.
- 4. All members playing in the society must be competent golfers ideally with club/society handicaps and the society organiser is required to sign the attached booking form and return it to the club with the non-refundable deposit. Handicap Certificates may be required to be produced.

COSTS

5. Please see attached sheet.

NUMBERS

6. The minimum number of players for a society is 12, or by special arrangement with the club Secretary/Manager.

BOOKING DETAIL

- 7. Final numbers for your Society must be confirmed to the Club Office on 020 8854 6368 as follows The Friday before for a Tuesday booking, Monday for a Thursday booking and Tuesday for Friday booking).
- 8. Should confirmation not be received the charges for the day will be based on numbers confirmed at the time of booking, or if greater, those attending on the day.
- 9. Should numbers fall following confirmation there will be a 50% charge for non-attendees.

CATERING

10. Attached is a menu from which you may choose your breakfast, snack lunch and evening meal, if applicable. Societies are requested to order the same two/three courses for lunch and dinner for all attendees. Menus can be tailored to your requirements by contacting the club's Caterer directly.

CANCELLATION

- 11. Should you have to cancel your day following receipt of your non-refundable deposit the Club may impose a further cancellation fee as follows:
 - 11.1 Less than 14 days 100% per booking requirements of full planned costs
 - 11.2 Less than 30 days 50% per booking requirements of full planned costs
 - 11.3 Less than 60 25% per booking requirements of full planned costs

PAYMENT

12. Full payment must be made to the club office or professional shop on the day before commencing play, and this can be made in cash, cheque or debit/credit card.

PLAYING ARRANGEMENTS

13. To avoid slow play and congestion on the course we advise that you have an even split of abilities in each group. It is recommended that play should be restricted to Stableford competitions with players picking up once no points can be achieved.

STARTING TIMES AND TEES

- 14. The course has one starting point for groups from the 1st Tee, unless agreed at the time of booking. The tee will be reserved for the number confirmed at the time of booking and should your group require additional or fewer tee times please contact the office immediately, so that the tee reservation can be revised.
- 15. The Society must adhere strictly to the starting times, and instructions of the Course Marshall, Club Professional, Office Staff or Club Director.

ON THE DAY

- 16. The society organiser must report to the office or the professional shop prior to play commencing to pay for the day and to receive an update of additional course local rules, other than prescribed on the scorecard.
- 17. Societies must play from yellow tee markers.
- 18. In the interests of the etiquette of the game of golf, it is imperative that slow play is avoided and that each match keeps close behind the one in front.
- 19. Only wide wheel trolleys are permitted on the course. If hiring a buggy please observe the 90° rule and report any damage to the Professional.

LIABILITY

20. Society members are responsible for the security of their own golf clubs and equipment, and should also be adequately insured for third party liability. *We ask all players to be aware of possible danger to themselves and fellow golfers from wayward shots and potential blind areas on the course. If you are unsure please do not play a stroke.* Please report to the office, or if closed, the professional shop or bar; any balls that have or may have crossed in to our neighbour's houses particularly along the 1st fairway or 18th tee, also on to Shooters Hill behind the 5th green.

The Club accepts no liability for any loss or damage, unless proven to be negligent.

IMPORTANT NOTES:

- 21. Society members are occasionally not fully briefed on the detail of their day. To avoid any embarrassment would the society organiser please ensure all attendees are fully conversant with the arrangement and requirements and bring this document with you on the day.
- 22. It is incumbent upon the society organiser to ensure that his/her society adheres to the Dress Rules of the Club (noted below) both on and off the course.
- 23. Mobile telephones are permitted to be used anywhere in the Clubhouse, but users are asked to respect other users of the Club. If a mobile telephone is taken onto the course, it must be switched to silent mode. In an emergency a mobile telephone may be used to summon help.

DRESS CODE

The Board has agreed a more relaxed approach to the dress code of the club to allow 'smart casual' attire in the clubhouse and terrace and 'appropriate golfing attire' to be worn on the golf course.

With the ever-changing fashion of golf footwear now being very similar to training shoes it does become increasingly difficult to manage the rule governing shoes. This also applies to the wearing of jeans, as, in many cases, trousers appear to be of denim material but are in fact made of different material such as brushed cotton; therefore, the wearing of smart jeans will be permitted under smart casual.

The staff on duty, club professional and Directors of the club will govern the interpretation of 'smart casual' and please respect their decision if you are approached.

The following is for your guidance: Please note that these may have changed and an up to date copy is published on the website.

ON THE COURSE

Appropriate golfing attire as follows, but not restricted to:

- Shirts roll neck, with a collar, or turtle neck to be tucked in to trousers/shorts. Ladies' golf shirts to be worn as designed.
- Trousers tailored or plus twos or plus fours.
- Men's Shorts to be tailored and worn with knee length socks pulled up or short predominantly white socks.
- Ladies' Shorts and Capri Trousers to be tailored and worn with ankle socks.
- **Headgear** to be worn correctly i.e. peaks facing forward.
- Golf Shoes recognised golf shoes designed and made for the purpose may be worn.

IN THE CLUBHOUSE

Smart Casual attire may be worn at all times with the following exceptions:

Lounge and Dining Room

- **Headgear** must be removed.
- Golfing attire may be worn but must not be muddy or wet.
- Tailored shorts may not be worn at any time
- Golf shoes may not be worn.
- Sandals or shoes without socks are not permitted.
- Waterproofs must be removed.
